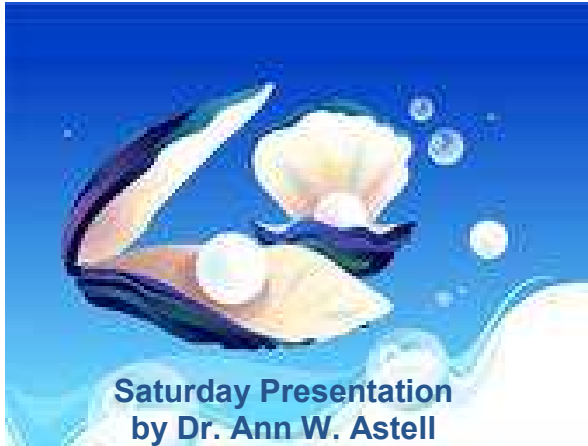

Ann W. Astell has been a member of the Secular Institute of the Schoenstatt Sisters of Mary since 1975. Professor of theology at the University of Notre Dame, she is President of the International Colloquium on Violence and Religion (COV&R) and Vice President/President Elect of the Society for the Study of Christian Spirituality (SSCS). She is the author of many books and articles on topics relevant to historical Christian spirituality, including *The Song of Songs in the Middle Ages* (1990) and *Eating Beauty: The Eucharist and the Spiritual Arts of the Middle Ages* (Cornell University Press, 2006). She is editor of *Lay Sanctity, Medieval and Modern: The Search for Models* (2000) and co-editor of *Joan of Arc and Spirituality* (2003).
